

### Targeted support for infrastructure

#### Electric Vehicle Homecharge Scheme (EVHS)

£ 500 towards a home chargepoint

#### **On-street Residential (OSR)**

£ 7,500 per chargepoint for Local Authorities

#### Workplace Charging Scheme (WCS)

£ 500 per workplace socket

#### **Highways England**

£ 15m Rapid chargepoint every 20 miles on the English SRN

#### Cities and local areas

£ 60m Funding for eight pathfinder cities in UK; and taxi chargepoints





### **Chargepoint Infrastructure Investment Fund**



To accelerate the rollout of charging infrastructure by providing access to finance to companies that deliver chargepoints
